Identify the risks	What are the risks associated with the activity/area	Is the risk low, moderate, significant or high?	If the risk is deemed unacceptable for the task, what will be done to reduce the risk?	By whom and by when?	Reassess the risk after placement of strategies?
Entering and exiting the vessel	Losing balance on gang plank, tripping into surrounding water	Moderate	Ask patrons to hold onto rails at all times. One person single file when entering the vessel. Walk at a slow pace.	Cruise organiser on the day. All patrons entering the vessel	Low
Outside areas of the vessel (upper & lower decks)	Patrons climbing on top of railings	High	Re enforcing the "two feet on the ground" at all times policy - this will be discussed in the safety briefing when patrons first enter the vessel. One carer must supervise upper and lower decks at all times.	Organiser will conduct safety briefing on arrival carers to be present on upper and lower decks at all times	Moderate
Hot food serving area	Burns from touching hot bain-marie	Moderate	Bain-marie area will supervised	Organiser will monitor	Low
Stairs and doorways	Tripping over, falling	High	All areas are clearly marked. These areas will all be pointed out in the initial safety brief.	Organiser to mark areas, conduct safety briefing. Patrons to make themselves aware of location of all stairs and doors.	Low

Electrical equipment and power sockets	Electrocution, Equipment falling	Moderate	Musical equipment will always be monitored, all electrical sockets are covered	Organiser will monitor equipment at all times and ensure power sockets are covered	Low
Windows	Jamming fingers, falling through window	High	All windows will be closed, reinforce the "2 feet on the ground" rule	Organiser will ensure all windows are closed and not touched	Low

How are the risks assessed?

What is the likely risk of the event happening?	Risk	Action
1=Low- it could happen, but only rarely	Score of 1-2 =Low risk	Proceed with caution
2 = Moderate - it could happen occasionally	Score of 3-4 =Moderate	Regularly monitor the situation
3 = High - It could frequently happen	Score of 5-6 =High	Do not proceed

Since children are on these cruises extra safety measures will be taken to ensure no one is injured. Tribal Warrior Association takes the issue of safety very seriously. Safety is everyone's responsibility. This will be further ensured on these cruises by:

1. Ensuring every patron is present for the initial safety briefing.
2. One carer per 20 children, children with disabilities have one carer per one child
3. Ensuring Captain's deck and bar area have doors closed at all times to ensure no one other than staff can enter.
